

John Wesley was took prayer very seriously. He would get up every morning at 4 am and enter his prayer closet, which was just off his bedroom, and enter a time of prayer for four hours.

Prayer, Wesley said, "is the grand means of drawing near to God" (Letter to Miss March, 3-29-1760); it is "the breath of our spiritual life" (NT Notes, I Thes. 5:16).

What is fascinating about John is that he used prayer more as a way to get closer to God rather than be in prayer for others, though this is important as well. Prayer is how we get connected to God and grow our faith. John Wesley would tell you that "neglect of private prayer" is the most common reason people lose their faith.

Because we are entering into a very important time, we want to be purposeful in thought and prayer and decisions. You are invited to step into the chapel, to take in its atmosphere and use the materials and space to pray about all that is before you in life. The doors to the church will be open at 9 am and the chapel will be accessible and ready for you with materials and ambiance every Wednesday morning through 7pm.







<u>It Wasn't Always Called Veterans Day</u> - Veterans Day was originally called Armistice Day, and it was meant to be a day that celebrated the victory of the Allied forces during World War I.

Americans Aren't the Only Ones Who Celebrate November 11

- Many countries around the world also celebrate November 11 (but as Remembrance Day rather than Veterans Day or Armistice

Day). These countries include the U.K., Canada, Australia, and France, among others.

<u>The Red Poppy Has a Purpose</u> - The WWI battlefield was a place where no life could flourish or even survive. After the fighting ceased and the bombings stopped, however, the ravaged land began to heal as nature took its course. During the healing process, red poppies bloomed and gave new life to the death-tainted landscape of WWI.

<u>There's a Reason It Isn't Spelled with an Apostrophe</u> - Veterans Day is not a day that belongs to Veterans or is owned by Veterans in any capacity. It is a day for everyone, regardless of if they've served or not, to reflect on the sacrifices of people who have served. The day may be dedicated to Veterans, but Veterans do not own it.

There Are More Women Veterans Than You Think! - At ease, men! Women make up approximately 10% of the Veteran population. By 2025, that number could reach 12%.

The Uniform Monday Holiday Act Changed the Observed Date - Congress signed the Uniform Monday Holiday Act in 1968, and it went into effect in 1971.it also changed the observed date of Veterans Day from November 11 to the fourth Monday in October. This sparked outrage among the population, and the date was changed back for the following year's celebrations.


<u>There's a National Moment of Silence for Veterans Day</u> - In 2016, President Barack Obama signed the Veterans Day Moment of Silence Act. This means that at 3:11 p.m. (Atlantic Standard Time) each Veterans Day, the current President will issue an official moment of silence for two minutes.

The Last U.S. WWI Vet Died in 2011 - The last living U.S. WWI Veteran is not so far removed from us. Just over a decade ago, Frank Buckles passed away, making him the final surviving U.S. WWI Vet. If you want to pay your respects to him, you can visit his gravesite at Arlington National Cemetery, where he was buried on March 15, 2011.

The War Didn't Actually End on 11/11/18 - You've surely heard about the eleventh hour of the eleventh day of the eleventh month The ending of World War I is officially marked by the signing of the Treaty of Versailles in France on June 28, 1919. However, we celebrate Veterans Day on November 11 because that date marked the beginning of the end of WWI.
