



#### KEEP CHRIST AT THE CENTER OF CHRISTMAS



Advent wreath

The advent wreath consists of a circular garland of evergreen representing the eternity of God with four candles, each representing an aspect of spiritual preparation of the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ. One candle is lit at each of four Advent Sunday services celebrating the Light of Christ coming into the world. The four candles proclaim the four weeks of Advent, each stand for one thousand years, to total 4000 years from the time of Adam and Eve until the birth of the Savior.

On the **first** Sunday of Advent we light the "Prophecy Candle" in remembrance of prophets, primarily Isaiah, who foretold the birth of Christ. (Isaiah 7:14). This purple or blue candle represents **Hope** in anticipation of the coming Messiah.

The **second** Sunday of Advent we light the "Bethlehem Candle" symbolizing Christ's manger (Luke 2:12). This purple or blue candle represents **Love** 

On the **third** Advent Sunday we light the "Shepherd's Candle" of rose/pink representing **Joy**. (Luke 2: 8-11)

The **fourth** Advent Sunday we light the "Angels Candle" which is purple or blue and represents **Peace**. (Luke 2:13-14)

On Christmas Eve we light the white "Christ Candle" representing <u>Purity</u> in the life and light of Christ that has come into the world. Christ is the sinless, spotless, and pure Savior. (Isaiah 1:18)

The Advent Wreath continually reminds us of whom we are called to be as the followers of Jesus.
