They might attend a service that recounts Jesus's painful crucifixion, and some even refrain from eating to show their sorrow. Churches strip their altars bare and muffle their bells as a sign of mourning.

We find it in Luke 23:32–33, There were also two others, criminals, led with Him to be put to death. And when they had come to the place called Calvary, there they crucified Him, and the criminals, one on the right hand and the other on the left.

Easter Sunday - Easter is a joyous holiday seen as the fulfillment of the prophecies of the Old Testament and the revelation of God's salvific plan for all of humankind. In commemorating the Resurrection of Jesus, Easter celebrates the defeat of death and the hope of salvation. Christian tradition holds that the sins of humanity were paid for by the death of Jesus and that his Resurrection represents the anticipation of eternal life for mankind.

Project Morning Star's residential recovery facility is located on a serene and picturesque farmstead eight miles south of Worthington Minnesota. It is surrounded by beautiful trees, fields of corn and soybean fields which provides a peaceful setting, perfect for self-reflection and spiritual growth. Both homes provide a safe, structured environment for both men and women who are committed to their recovery, and ready to rebuild their lives for the future.

During this program of recovery, participants have the security of private rooms, fellowship in dinner together, are responsible for monthly rent and following all house rules as they find support and encouragement while participating in many outside activities which provide assistance to their own recovery plans. All residents are required to find employment within 30 days of entry into the program, or they may have the option of working at the facility until they can find employment.

There is a zero tolerance policy for drug and alcohol use while in the program, undergoing periodic inspections and random screening for prohibited substances. Personal responsibility, accountability, and integrity are vital to success. Participants are also required to share in household duties such as cleaning, grounds maintenance and preparation of community meals, as well as attending weekly services at the church of their choice.
